STATEWIDE PROPOSITIONS

1 SUPPORT	Veterans and Affordable Housing Bond A legislatively referred bond measure, placed on the ballot via Senate Bill 417 with bipartisan majorities in both chambers, authorizing \$11.25 billion in general obligation bonds: roughly \$10 billion for state affordable-housing programs (construction, rehabilitation, preservation, homeownership assistance, and homelessness programs) and \$1.25 billion for the CalVet Home Loan Program, which is repaid through veterans' loan payments.
3 SUPPORT	Permanent Extension of the High-Earner Income Tax Amends the California Constitution to permanently extend the higher marginal income-tax rates on incomes above \$361,000 (single) and \$721,000 (joint) adopted under Proposition 30 (2012) and Proposition 55 (2016) and set to expire in 2031, dedicating the revenue to education.
5 SUPPORT	Recall Election Reform Amends the California Constitution to remove the requirement that a successor election be held simultaneously with a recall. If an officer is recalled, the office remains vacant until filled through normal succession or appointment procedures.
39 OPPOSE	Voter Identification Requirements This initiative would require voters to show government-issued identification at the polls and order election officials to verify that all registered voters are U.S. citizens. Voters who cast a mail-in ballot would need to give the last four digits of a government ID, such as a driver's license number. California currently requires residents to provide an identification card and Social Security number to register to vote, but does not request it at polling places.
40 OPPOSE	Billionaire Tax Proposition 40 would require the estimated 200 Californians whose net worth exceeded \$1 billion at the start of this year to pay a one-time 5% tax. Service Employees International Union-United Healthcare Workers West, the group sponsoring the measure, projects that it would raise roughly \$100 billion over five years. That money would be earmarked primarily for healthcare, with some reserved for food assistance and education. If propositions 41 or 42 earn more votes than Proposition 40, this measure would be nullified.
42 SUPPORT	Prohibit New Personal Property Tax & Retroactive Taxes Proposition 42 is meant to make it much harder to create a wealth tax in California by prohibiting new taxes on the mere ownership of assets such as investment accounts, business interests and personal property — assets that are typically only taxed when they are sold or generate income. Like Proposition 41, which also attempts to block Proposition 40 (a wealth tax on billionaires), Proposition 42 would nullify Proposition 40 if it receives more votes, even if the billionaire tax also passes.
43 OPPOSE	Higher Threshold for Local Special Taxes Amends the California Constitution to require a two-thirds supermajority for voter approval of citizen-initiated local special-tax measures, and separately prohibits charter cities from imposing or increasing real estate transfer taxes. Would reverse a 2017 state supreme court ruling that allowed citizen-initiated special taxes to pass by simple majority.
45 OPPOSE	Guts CEQA Proposition 45, or the “Building an Affordable California Act,” would overhaul the state’s environmental review law, the California Environmental Quality Act. Sponsored by the California Chamber of Commerce, the measure aims to help developers build certain projects more quickly and easily, with the idea that it’ll lower costs for residents. The measure would impose a 365-day limit on environmental reviews for projects it designates as the most essential, including infrastructure like roads and bridges, along with schools, broadband, and wildfire mitigation. It would also require courts to rule within 270 days on lawsuits related to the environmental review law.
